# **Financial Summary**

Treasurer Dan Brady presented an overview of the financial situation of the organization. Fundraising campaigns have netted slightly over \$8,000, membership dues holding steady. Need to raise money to recoup expenses for purchase of Silver

Lodge. Gift shop revenues down, but so are expenses. RALs are down a bit, but special events are up. Revenues to date are where they were at this time last year. Expenses have been kept down and in line with revenue. Copies of reports are available at the Museum for pickup or mailing.

Investment account doing well. Our broker has left Dain Raucher and is now with Smith Barney. He has asked that we move our accounts to his new brokerage house. Board Direction was given to the Treasurer to follow his best judgment – he has recommended we continue with Dain Raucher and consider a change if we have any issues.

Mr. Brady also advised that he has commissioned a new winter scene print which he will coordinate with John to offer for sale in the gift shop.

He also highly suggested we consider recruitment of new volunteers. There was discussion regarding some new volunteer assignments and the fact that we are starting to see some new faces on the property.

On a side note, President McClure directed Mr. Brady to pursue discussion of sale of MILW 5057 to an organization in Cle Elem, Washington to which this unit is historically significant.

Once again, Treasurer Brady was thanked by the Board for his hard work and excellent counsel in the financial matters of the organization.

# New Business

#### Wheelchair Lift Purchase

Director Vicknair presented a report regarding the opportunity to purchase a manual wheelchair lift belonging to a co-worker of member Alan Hirasawa. Item was a back-up lift for Amtrak and was built in 1992. He inspected the lift and with the exception of minor repairs, it appears to be in good shape and working condition. Purchase price is \$800. New lifts run around \$7,500 not including shipping. Dan Brady generously offered to donate \$400 if Board members would pledge the rest. The following Board members each pledged \$100 toward the purchase of the lift: Norm Holmes, Gail McClure, Wayne Monger, Hank Stiles. The following Board members each pledged \$100 toward any needed repairs: Kerry Cochran, Eugene Vicknair.

#### **WP 484 Caboose Restoration**

Director Habeck requested that the Board consider a proposal to approve a cosmetic restoration of the WP 484 caboose. This caboose was one of the last six ordered by the WP and delivered in May 1980. President McClure and Director Habeck will be responsible for a Hospital Equipment move from Portola, CA to Cheyenne, WY for the UP's Historic Locomotive Program. The UP has requested that the caboose accompany the equipment for the purpose of transporting tools and other equipment which may be required on the trip. They have recommended that the caboose be returned to Portola as part of the UP 3985 Steam Train. As an ambassador for the FRRS, it would be beneficial for the caboose to receive a cosmetic restoration prior to use in mainline service. This year also represents the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its build date/receipt by the WP.

Anticipated costs are \$4,000 for prep, paint and lettering. Director Habeck pledged \$500 and Director Stiles pledged \$100 toward the project. Director Vicknair was instructed to conduct an internet fundraising effort toward this project.

Motion # 05-07-05 — Approval of cosmetic restoration of exterior of WP 484 caboose, in an amount not to exceed \$4,000 to be funded from budgetary line item 56000 — Restorations, with a specific line item to be created for WP 484 under this general category, and supported by an internet fundraiser. Motion made by Director Vicknair, seconded by Director Stiles. All Directors present voted in favor with the exception on Director Habeck, who abstained. Motion carried.

# **President's Report**
