SUBJECT: 2014 Historical Convention

Despite the compressed advertising and some concerns about getting enough clinics / presentations, the 2014 Convention in Fairfield seemed to be very well received. While the attendance numbers were down, we think we know why and this is discussed below. Despite the low attendance, the convention did make money for the archives.

### Notes:

- There was a payment of \$1,200 to Vic Neves for A/V equipment rental and services that will be repaid as caboose space rental for the next year. This is not accounted in the totals.
- There are some outstanding reimbursements that need to be settled in the total amount of \$715.00. These should be settled by the Board Meeting.
- There was \$293.00 in expenditures made for materials that, while purchased for the convention, are reusable items that will be used by the museum in general or at the 2015 convention. These are not

accounted in the totals and include a new Store Printer, sign holders and an order of lanyards that were not delivered in time for the convention.

- I believe Wayne has 1 outstanding receipt for about \$65.00 for replacement lanyards.

### **Attendance Numbers**

2014 Convention: 98 Convention

83 Banquet

2013 Convention: 139 Convention

109 Banquet

The lower attendance numbers can be attributed partly to getting advertising out later than usual, but a majority issue seems to be the August date. While some convention goers expressed approval of the later date, most attendees and many who did not register prefer spring.

If we had reached 2013 attendance numbers, the income would have been about \$2,000 higher in terms of registration and banquet net after estimated expenses.

#### Raffle

In 2013, the raffle made \$1,077.00. This year, it made less, \$834.00, however there were less attendees.

The raffle income per attendee in 2014 was \$8.51, while in 2013 it was \$7.75.

Also note that in 2013, raffle tickets were sold in two locations (FRRS table and Registration table), while in 2014 the raffle sales were only at the Registration table.

Many attendees expressed approval of the "voting" aspect introduced into the Raffle this year and it did seem to spur sales. They liked the idea of having input into the location of the next convention. The two choices were San Jose and Elko, with Elko being the winner.
