SUBJECT: Meeting with City Council and Rotary, ESPN Radio

On September 27, I gave a presentation on the Society and its future plans to the Portola Rotary Club. The response was very positive and I received a lot of statements of support. To add to this, the Rotary is providing 6-8 volunteers to help us with clean-up from Pumpkin Trains and to help set up for Santa Trains.

The following evening, I gave a similar presentation at the Portola City Council Meeting, again to enthusiastic response. In the days following, I received several emails from residents and city workers thanking me for the presentation and stating support for the Society and Museum. In particular, Susan Jacobson, who heads the local sports and events group, has asked to work with us on their plans for the old Ballfield property and on coordinating events and space at the museum to work with their group on cooperative ventures.

On Thursday, September 29, I was interviewed on the "Pit Lane" show on the Reno ESPN affiliate. Todd Brusso, a fan of the museum, is one of the hosts and they focuses on some general info about the museum before promoting the Pumpkin and Santa Trains. Thanks to efforts by Mr. Brusso and Patty Clawson, parent company of the station Lotus Communications has started airing a series of 30 second Public Service Announcements promoting the Museum and Pumpkin Trains. These meetings were set up thanks to the efforts of Big Fish and Robert Meacher. I have continued to work with them and we have some more meetings tentatively scheduled to work on fundraising for the Society and the display building.
