Policy Statement

Overall Accountability

The Board of Directors is responsible for issuing, updating, and monitoring compliance with this policy.

Scope

This policy applies to the Feather River Rail Society and all subsidiaries. (Portola Railroad Museum) (Western Pacific Railroad Historical Society)

Definitions

The FRRS Mission is the reason for its existence as a public benefit non-profit corporation.

The FRRS goals are the major achievements or ways of doing business that are essential to the successful attainment of the Society's mission.

Implementation: Feather River Rail Society

1. Mission Statement

The Feather River Rail Society is dedicated to the preservation, interpretation and education of the public as to the history and people of the Western Pacific Railroad.

2. <u>Mission Goals</u>

The Feather River Rail Society goals are as follows:

(a) To preserve and interpret the history of the WP, the "Willing People" as a vital link in the development of the rail industry on the west coast, including the evolution of the steam and diesel locomotive, WP's influence in the passenger tourism industry, the impact of freight competition between neighboring railroads, WP's influence in the lumber, mining and agriculture industry from Plumas County throughout northern California.

- (e) Gift Shop Operations: Develop a gift shop business that builds on our experience and expertise and, over time, produces returns that would help support the <u>Portola Western Pacific Railroad Museum and</u> the goals of the Feather River Rail Society.
- (f) Human Resources/Volunteer Services: Build a team of volunteers proficient in the technical, business, and communications skills necessary to achieve the FRRS's success in an increasingly diverse society, and provide volunteers the opportunity for fulfilling careers and individual growth goals in cooperation with the FRRS.
