The Society ended 2017 and began 2018 with major celebrations for two of our most significant artifacts. In September 2017, we celebrated the 100th anniversary of Western Pacific business car 106, better known as the "Charles O. Sweetwood". This is the unique Pullman observation car that served as a rolling Blood Bank during the Korean War. In April 2018, the museum hosted "Light the Fire", a fundraising dinner that honored our steam restoration crew and WP 0-6-0 165, while raising funds to return this 99 year old engine to operation in time for its next birthday.



Such events are high profile, but they are just two more pieces in an on-going series of projects to preserve the history of the Western Pacific. Thanks to the support of you, the members of the FRRS, work advances on our archives, including cataloging the existing collection and building our new Archives Research Facility. Mechanical work progresses on motive power such as WP F7A 917-D, recently returned to operation, and RAL stalwarts such as Quincy TR6A 1100 and U.S. Army H-12-44 1857. A recent work weekend and help from local Boy Scout troops saw major cleaning of the overall facility and improvements to displayed equipment such as Union Pacific DDA40X 6946.
