



Weekends only during winter months. Operations the last weekend of each summer month and September.








We have leased the former Western Pacific diesel shop building and adjacent track area in Portola from the Union Pacific through the City of Portola for our museum site. The 37 acres included in the lease has about 12,000 feet of track including a balloon track for turning equipment and a 16,000 sq. ft. shop building with two tracks running the 220 foot length. A repair and restoration shop facility, library, office and meeting rooms will be included within the structure. Other property improvements include a replica W.P. passenger depot, freight depot for a future model railroad layout, section house, water tank and a picnic and park area.


