WHAT IS EXPECTED OF YOU

- You must be a member in good standing of the Feather River Rail Society, with a membership level of Active or above.
- To promote up through the Train and Engine Service positions, you must meet all of the requirements, no exceptions.
 - Safety is of the first importance in the discharge of duty.
 - Obedience to the rules is essential to safety and is required.
 - To enter or remain in the service is an assurance of willingness to obey the rules. The service demands the faithful, intelligent and courteous discharge of duty.
- The utmost care and diligence must be used in the maintenance and handling of museum equipment, due to its unique nature, age and historical significance.
- To obtain promotion, ability must be shown for greater responsibility.
- Cooperation is essential to success. Cooperation between employees and volunteers is required for proper functioning under the rules and instructions.



SAFETY 1st

- SAFETY is the top priority!!!!
- On the job SAFETY is a top priority. SAFETY means many things to many people in Train Operations, however, it has two main components:
 - the physical work place and
 - employee and volunteer awareness.
 - The first component, the work place, is to be kept safe with proper SAFETY equipment, such as fall protection gear, hard hats, job site protection, etc.
- Unfortunately, the second component of SAFETY volunteer/employee awareness – isn't as simple as supplying workers with the right tools and rules, the volunteer/employee must also use them!!!
 - "I don't need the new gloves, the old gloves worked just fine."
 - "I like my old hard hat, I have had it for over 12 years and don't want to turn it in."



OBEDIENCE TO THE RULES IS ESSENTIAL TO SAFETY AND IS REQUIRED

REMEMBER, SAFETY IS ALWAYS OUR NUMBER ONE PRIORITY:

- SAFETY FOR THE PUBLIC,
- SAFETY FOR YOU AND THE REST OF THE TRAIN CREW AND
- THE SAFETY OF OUR EQUIPMENT.

What does this statement mean...

- We are all responsible for SAFETY.
- The short answer is "we all are", but that too often leads to "everyone but me". The complete answer is "we all are within the context of our training, our job responsibilities and our commitment to our coworkers and the public".
- It is very much the same as saying we are each responsible for our actions on the job.
