While work continues on the MP archives car to get it ready for electrical power and the new HVAC unit, we needed to complete several things prior to some of that work being started.

On Wednesday May 29th, Paul Finnegan, Phil Schmierer, Vince Bonfiglio, Ethan Doty and Kerry Cochran spent most of the afternoon moving the old desk partitions, refrigerator and various left over lumber and insulation out of the car.

The desk partitions were stored in one of the other archives cars for use at a later time, the refrigerator was loaded into the Dodge pick-up for disposal and the reusable lumber was moved to the lumber rack inside the engine house.

Other loose items, lumber scraps, insulation and junk that we deemed unusable were placed into the dumpster for disposal.

A set of lockers was moved into the east end of the car along with one of the tall metal cabinets for storage of materials.

I want to thank all the members that helped get this work done as we progress into preparing this car for the next steps in its renovations.

All bells pointing forward mounted on the face of the cab, close to the roof, instead of on the roof as it currently is.

Roger Stabler shot orange paint on the sides and ends just before the Steam Work session in May. Stencils need to be cut for the lettering and Roger plans to shot more paint in July.

The Mechanical Department has an aggressive plan to restore WP 1503 to service this summer.
